Repeater: Experienced researchers who have had exposure to many of the topics covered.

Facilitator: Very experienced researchers who will be asked to take a leadership role in facilitating some workshop activities

Attendance: As a regional UROC Researcher or Scholar, participation in this program and the culminating Summer Research Symposium (August 12, 2016) is mandatory.

Newbies are required to attend all 10 weeks of classes plus the Symposium.

Repeaters and *Facilitators* are encouraged to attend as many class dates as possible but are required to attend weeks 1, 2, 9, 10, and one other of their choosing, in addition to the Symposium (= five classes plus Symposium). They will also be asked to meet with their writing groups as necessary.

Excessive absenteeism will negatively affect your potential for continued receipt of UROC support, including research funding. If your absence is unavoidable you must notify us ahead of time using this Google form:
